

Our Lady of Fatima and Russia



Our Lady of Fatima, July 13, 1917: *“You see hell, where the souls of poor sinners go. God is going to punish the world for its crimes by means of war, of hunger, and of persecution of the Church and of the Holy Father. To prevent this I come to ask the consecration of Russia to my Immaculate Heart. If they listen to my requests, Russia will be converted and there will be peace. If not Russia will scatter her errors through the world, provoking wars and persecutions of the Church. **The good will be martyred, the Holy Father will have much to suffer, various nations will be annihilated.**”*

Russia Will Scatter Her Errors Throughout The World

Yes, Russia has spread her errors throughout the world. In 1917, Russia became the first communist country in the world. In 1920, Russia was the first country in the world to legalize abortion. The Errors of Russia have quickly spread throughout the world. Russia established the Soviet Union. The errors of Communism have spread from Russia to Eastern Europe and to: North Korea, China, Cuba, Laos, Vietnam.

The Good Will Be Martyred

From 1917 to 1991, more than 60 million people were murdered in Russia. Countless Catholics were martyred at the hands of the [Russia] Soviet Union and its Communist government agents. Thousands of Catholic and Orthodox bishops, priests, brothers and nuns were shot. Hundreds of churches in Russia were closed and destroyed, great numbers of icons were burned, all workers and school children were compelled to work and the Sanctity of Sundays were suppressed, and all people were demanded to sign a declaration of formal hatred against God. All children were forced to learn and believe atheism as scientific truth in all levels of school and in all youth organizations. No private schools or clubs were allowed. The harsh religious persecution made the parents afraid to tell their children about God.



The Holy Father Will Have Much To Suffer

The persecution of the Church during that period, the torture and martyrdom of priests and faithful, the suppression of ecclesiastical activity, were an incredible burden and torment on the Pope who felt responsible, yet helpless, in the face of this tragedy.

Has Russia Been Consecrated by the Pope?

Pope Pius XII specifically consecrated Russia to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on July 7, 1952.



Pope Pius XII, Sacro Vergente Anno, July 7, 1952: *“...just as a few years ago We consecrated the entire human race to the Immaculate Heart of the Virgin Mary, Mother of God, so today **We consecrate and in a most special manner We entrust all the peoples of Russia to this Immaculate Heart...**”*

Thus, it is an undeniable fact that Pope Pius XII specifically consecrated Russia to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

On July 13, 1917, the Blessed Virgin Mary requested the Pope to consecrate Russia. After 35 years, on July 7, 1952, Pope Pius XII made the first papal consecration of Russia to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

Has Russia Really Converted?

December of 1991, 39 years after Pope Pius XII consecrated Russia, the Soviet Union finally collapsed.



Russia was baptized as an Eastern Catholic nation in 988. Russia was an Eastern Catholic country in communion with Rome. In short, Russia was a Catholic Country before the Great Schism - between the Eastern Church and the Western Church in 1054. Years after the Great Schism, Russia ceased to be a Catholic country. Then, Russia fell under Communism from 1917 to 1991, it was a godless period in Russia.

Russia's official religion is the Russian Orthodox Church. It maintains the Rite or the Liturgy of the Eastern Church in communion with Rome. But the Russian Orthodox Church is a schismatic church. There is only one true Christian Church that dates back to Christ, founded on St. Peter, and promised by Christ that the gates of hell would not prevail against it. That Church is the Roman Catholic Church.

Today's Russia is far from conversion to the Catholic Church. Though not a Catholic country, Russia contributes to the promotion of moral values in the society.
